

6.1 European Documentation Centre

Located in the Department of Government and International Studies (GIS) is the European Documentation Centre (EDC), sponsored by the European Commission of the European Union since 1997. It is a specialist library open for public use which receives, on a regular basis, all the official publications of the institutions of the European Union as well as the bulletins, reports, policy statements, statistical materials, records of debates, etc., that emerge from the various bodies of the Union. The EDC also has privileged access to the European Union's databases and other European information networks; among such networks, the EDC is a member of EURODOC, an international network linking various EDCs which provides an efficient help line for all enquiries concerning the European Union.

The EDC maintains its own homepage - <http://www.hkbu.edu.hk/~europe/edc/> - together with the European Studies Homepage, which provides additional information on all aspects dealing with Europe. The EDC Homepage also carries a regular newsletter.

The EDC is open from Monday to Friday, 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., and on Saturday by appointment only. The Centre is committed to bringing Europe closer to the public of Hong Kong. Its current location is Room DLB 803A, David C. Lam Building.

6.2 Information Technology Services Centre

The ITSC provides and supports the following IT facilities for staff and students:

1. A high-speed Gigabit Ethernet network backbone across three campuses.
2. Wireless LAN access for Library, lecture theatres and designated classrooms and public areas.
3. ITSC-installed public phones for common areas, student residence halls, classrooms and student/staff common rooms.
4. Linking the campus network with the remote Shatin Staff Quarters and the HARNET (Hong Kong Academic and Research Network).
5. Every user is provided with at least one computer account for accessing Internet services and facilities.
6. VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol) telephone system is serving the users across three campuses.
7. Every user in the student residence hall is provided with a data port connecting to the campus network.
8. Viewing of VoD (Video on Demand), video conferencing and TV re-broadcasting is made available on desktop PC's connected to the campus network.
9. A modem-pool for remote dial-in.
10. A standard TV studio and audio studio for multimedia productions.
11. A self-service room for producing high quality teaching materials.
12. Three ITSC-managed User Computing Centres comprising 278 networked PC's and laser printers.
13. A0-sized plotter, OMR (Optical Mark Reader) and color laser printing services.
